- New Jersey Test Results
 - One Type II (recert)
 - Three Type I (2 recerts)
- Certification Extension Request
 - A team failed their Type I recert 1 year ago and has thus been a Type II for a year. They are unable to re-test Type I at this point due to K9 requiring TPLO surgery, which necessitates an extended rehab period. While the CWG acknowledges that due to conditions beyond their control the team cannot recert Type I within the required timeframe, the request for a waiver to extend type I certification is denied.
- CSST Course
 - Though it is the recommendation of the CWG to revamp the CSST course, a Task Force may fund and host a CSST course until the new program is completed.
- Retirement from Type I Status
 - A Type I team must take a Type I or Type II test to remain certified. They cannot choose to automatically revert to Type II status.
