- 4) Merial Proposal update**
  - Quest is sending kits to vets upon receipt of enrollment forms from vets
  - Handlers need to check with their vets to be sure that the enrollment form has been sent
  - All 28 TFs are signed up to participate

**5) Input and update from SWG**

- Rory reported that the IST Search Specialist Position has been approved and is out for 21-day review
- The Evacuee Accountability form was also approved for use by all TFs to ensure uniformity
- Looking at technological advances to improve the Search function, ie Air Robot, electronic data entry in the field, as well as mapping and GPS technology
- Dissussing Victim Labels in addition to the Search Labels

**6) Review Pass Rates YTD**

- 78% YTD, but based only on two CE's
- CP numbers are skewed as some were training and not true CPs
  - CPs are two day events—Day 1 is a mock test and Day two is training based on Day 1 observations.
  - Extra training that is tacked onto a test will not be labeled as a CP

**7) Review Attempts Chart**

- Teams are passing in three or less attempts, most teams passing on the first or second attempt
- Canine Coordinators will continue to track their individual teams' attempts and CSG will continue to track attempts for statistical reporting

- Rewrote the recommendation and added parameters for vehicles

**12) Open Discussion Items**

- FSA evaluators
  - TFs with only two Evaluators must bring in an outside Evaluator when one of their two Evaluators needs an FSA
  - CSG unanimously agreed to amend this policy to read "Two rostered evaluators OR one rostered evaluator and the sponsoring Task Force Canine Coordinator (or his/her designee) shall administer this assessment"

- Verbiage included in revised CSSCP to be reviewed by TFLs and effective July 1, 2009 (contingent upon approval)
- Distractions on CEs/CPs
  - Will address on pre-eval telecons
- SOP's—Evaluator pay
  - CSG will discuss with Program Office as to raising the Evaluator pay in the SOW, which has remained the same (\$300/dy, \$37.50/hr) since 2004. CE/CP funding has increased 10K since 2004.
  - Discussion as to aligning Evaluator salary with Instructor rates. Agreed that Leads and non-Leads should be on the same pay-scale. CSG unanimously agreed to request that the daily rate be raised to \$400 for all Evaluators (approx \$50/hr).
  - Method of payment is up to the individual Host TF and will be outlined in the Evaluator/Host TF Participation Agt (to be developed)
- Mandatory vet checks
  - Recommendation developed for pre-mission hands-on veterinary exams and post-mission health screenings
  - Will ask for examples of the pre-mission exam from Canine Coordinators
- Shadow experiences
  - CSG unanimously agreed to leave the present Evaluator requirements in place—Shadow experiences will not count towards fulfilling requirements to maintain status or for Lead status.
- Limited Access Site
  - Comment - A dog may bark at a spot as Handler is returning to start and Handler may visually note this spot. Handler may then identify it when he gains access again, but it's not technically an out-of-sight alert/find.
  - Discussion – Is this a true problem or a possible loophole? Agreed to monitor, but leave verbiage as-is for this review period.
  - Comment - To assess D&C, require finding 2 victims on Limited Access?
  - Discussion – Some dogs find all victims with minimal D&C on a given day. Agreed to monitor, but to leave verbiage as-is for this review period.

### **14) Annual Review of Documents**

- Mission Statement
  - Re-affirmed
- CSSCP
  - CSG, along with SWG and Program Office, reviewed and updated the document, to be reviewed by TFLs and effective July 1, 2009 (contingent upon approval)
- Policies
  - All information was incorporated into the appropriate documents.
  - Vet documentation for testing canines 10 yrs or older was deleted as a policy, as it is a Task Force responsibility to ensure the health of their canines at all times.
  - Canines in season will not be knowingly accomodated at FEMA canine events.

- SOPs for CE/CP
  - An **Evaluator/Host TF Participation Agreement** template is being developed to outline the individual Host TF's policies as to travel arrangements and payments for Evaluators
- Apps/Forms
  - Evaluator applications revised to reflect intended chronology of completion of requirements
  - FSA score sheet revised as to a typo—"Stop and Turn on ANY obstacle"
  - All apps/forms updated as to FEMA logo's, etc.
- Peer Reviews
  - Evaluator Peer Reviews have been developed
- Shadow Package
  - Reviewed—no change
- CE/CP Orientations
  - Reviewed and updated
- Pre-evaluator call template
  - Updated to include all revisions as a result of this meeting

  - Revised score sheets
  - Revised to state that the two Assessors shall be chosen by the Canine Coordinator
  - Revised to add "Urinalysis" to vet exam, which was inadvertently omitted
  - Rec remains Tabled until Program Office supplies guidelines for Acquisition and Disposition

- Comment – Consider requiring informed consent for mission and task
- Discussion – CSG position remains:

*The Canine Sub-Group supports the position that the Canine Search Specialist, along with his/her canine resource, should be available to deploy on any search mission.*

*Safety is assumed to be of paramount concern, but risk should not prohibit deployment.*

  - Canines may be 25% to 50% more susceptible to effects of radiation than humans. Stats based on laboratory tests only. Check [usarveterinarygroup.org](http://usarveterinarygroup.org) for more info.
