## Officials Try to Shield Police, Military Dogs from Canine Flu

Following an outbreak of H3N8 canine influenza in Fairfax County, Va., which by Friday had left one dog dead and dozens quarantined with flu-like symptoms, county officials are trying to safeguard local working military and police canines. "The things we really look for are vomiting, diarrhea and if they seem fatigued in the field during training," said Army Sgt. 1st Class William Etheridge, kennel master at the 212th Military Police Detachment's canine unit, located on Fort Belvoir. Ethridge is scrubbing the kennels daily and bathing the dogs regularly, at least once a week. Because ticks are common on the heavily wooded base, he and the handlers inspect the dogs often throughout the day and would notice if they were sick. While off base and out in the community, military dogs run the risk of coming into contact with sick dogs or contaminated areas. "The virus can survive for up to 48 hours on clothes and hair." The flu can spread from one dog to another on the street by secretions, such as saliva on a fire hydrant. But the places of greatest concern are those where large populations of dogs are kept in close proximity, such as a shelter or boarding facility. Although coughing is not uncommon among dogs, it could signal flu. Dogs with H3N8 are most contagious when they are not showing symptoms.
